# Travel details

## Where is the Textile ETP taking place?

The 18th Textile ETP Annual Conference will take place at the <u>Lamot Congress and Heritage</u> <u>Centre</u>, located at Van Beethovenstraat 8/10, 2800 Mechelen, Belgium.

Please note that the networking cocktail on Tuesday 14 May does <u>not</u> take place at the same place than the conference but at <u>Salons Van Dijck</u>, <u>located in Frederik de Merodestraat 33, 2800</u> Mechelen (less than 10min walk for the conference venue).

## How to get there?

Mechelen is a charming Belgian town, located 25km away from Brussels, Belgium. It is easily accessible by public transport and taxi from Brussels airport and city centre:

#### • From Brussels Airport:

- By train: Brussels Airport railway station is on level -1. A direct express train will take you to Mechelen Central station in just 11 minutes! A ticket costs €10.40.
- <u>By bus</u>: Brussels Airport bus station is on level 0. De Lijn provides a direct bus service to Mechelen station twice an hour, including lines 282, 681, 682, 683 and 686. The bus journey takes 45 minutes. A ticket costs around €3.
- By taxi: Brussels Airport taxi station is on level 0. The journey takes approximately 25 minutes. The ride costs around €50-60.

### From Brussels city centre:

- <u>By train</u>: Mechelen can be reached from the 3 main train stations of Brussels (Brussels Midi, Brussels Central and Brussels North). Direct trains will bring you to Mechelen Central station in 15-30 min depending on the Brussels station where you board the train. A ticket costs €5.50.
- o By taxi: Taxis are available throughout the city. The journey takes approximately 45 minutes. The ride costs around €70-80.
